UPDATES



We're continuing to have discussions to see if becoming a Conservation District is something that Windsor Park should pursue as a neighborhood.

HERE'S SOME Q + A'S WE'VE HAD SO FAR.

Q. WHAT IS A CONSERVATION DISTRICT?

A. A Conservation District is a historical designation that's bestowed by the Indianapolis Historic Preservation Committee after a lengthy approval process by the neighborhood. To have a Conservation District approved by the IHPC, they require at least a 70% "Yes" vote by ALL homeowners within a neighborhood. At some point the WPNA will be canvasing the neighborhood to talk to and educate everyone; homeowners AND renters.

Q. WHY WINDSOR PARK NEED THIS DESIGNATION?

A. The Neighborhood Association started this conversation this past winter when reports from the Indiana Department Transportation listed our neighborhood's historical assets and recommended that our neighborhood be included along with the other IHPC neighborhoods.

Q. BUT IS WINDSOR PARK EVEN A HISTORIC NEIGHBORHOOD?

A. Windsor Park is indeed historic. Milligan's Park and Windsor Place were subdivided and platted out of a large Fletcher Farm/Estate in the mid-1870's. Lots moved slowly until the mid-1880s when a trolley line was completed along Clifford Avenue (10th St.) Overnight homes sprung up in all corners of the neighborhood, in fact most homes were built between 1885 — 1895. Windsor Park became a perfect example of what's called a "Victorian Era Trolley Suburb." A self contained neighborhood close to downtown, but with it's own shopping, nightlife/entertainment venues concentrated at specific cross streets throughout it's defined borders. Over the course of the IHPC process we'll be working with an historian and an architectural preservationist to help identify what's truly unique about our neighborhood.

Q. WILL THIS FURTHER GENTRIFY THE NEIGHBORHOOD?

A. This is our primary concerns. We want Windsor Park to continue to be affordable for everyone! We cannot stress this enough — as we move forward in this process we will continue to fight to ensure that everyone has a seat at the table.

Q. WHAT IS THE TIMELINE FOR THIS?

A. The process from start to finish is about 2 years. We've been hard at work

researching the process and what the potential impact this could have on everyone in our neighborhood. Please follow our Facebook, Instagram and Newsletters to stay up to date. And as always we encourage everyone to come to our meetings! The WPNA love meeting new faces!

Q. WILL I NEED TO UPDATE MY HOME TO WOOD SIDING OR HAVE SINGLE PANED WINDOWS?

A. While a Historic District is meant to protect a neighborhood's historic architectural integrity by utilizing strict architectural guidelines and approval methods (think Lockerbie Square or the Old Northside), a Conservation District (think Cottage Home) is meant to protect a neighborhood's "unique" character and that is most often done through scale and setback restrictions. However depending on what the neighborhood agrees upon, that could include siding and window size restrictions. The neighborhood makes the rules but then the IHPC enforces them.

SPRING CLEAN-UP! THIS SATURDAY!

It's that time of the year again when Windsor Parkians come together to clean up our beautiful streets! We'll be starting at LYN House (1155 Tecumseh Street) for breakfast at 10am with cleaning starting at 10:30 until 1 or 2pm. Keep Indianapolis Beautiful will be providing some gloves, bags and trash pickers, volunteers are encouraged to bring their own. There will be supplies and dispatch maps at LYN house. A dumpster will be placed at 1930 Commerce.

BROOKSIDE AVENUE

By now you've probably noticed the road closure along Brookside Avenue starting 10th. (11th Street, 12th Street and Arsenal will also be closed at Brookside.) DPW and Citizens Energy are working on a project intended to address the ongoing drainage and flooding issues along Brookside from 10th Street to Newman. New drains should capture most of the water that currently runs down Brookside and into the CCIC bays and also the water that runs down Arsenal from Brookside. This project will not eliminate water infiltrating the CCIC bays that sit lower than the street nor will it resolve the ponding water at the south east corner of Arsenal and Brookside. The project will take four to five months having an anticipated completion date of July 31, 2018. *Trail access will be impacted periodically. Sidewalks will be similarly impacted.*
